## FAIR-CHARTER BY YACHT-POOL

ICOMIA and EBI declare the insurance broker's "Fair Contract" as a global model for the charter industry.

r. Friedrich Schöchl (pictured), founder and CEO of Yacht-Pool, is among the pioneers of yacht insurance. This applies to both comprehensive insurance, where he introduced all-risk coverage, and seven charter insurances, notably the Skipper Liability he brought to the market (BOOTE 2/2022). However, Schöchl is much more than an insurance broker.

The clear conditions of the Fair-Charter Contract by YACHT-POOL convinced international organisations for the recreational boating.

Rooted in a boatbuilder family in the Austrian Mattsee (Sunbeam Yachts), he takes responsibility for

the industry as a whole acting like an ombudsman. Fairness is his benchmark. If he perceives something as unjust or unfair, he aims to transform it into a positive outcome. This was the case with charter contracts from agencies and fleet operators. Because he repeatedly discovered "Dangerous Clauses" (BOOTE 7/16) in these contracts, imposing incalculable risks on the charterer and virtually programming disputes in court, he created the "Charter-Fair Contract" as an alternative about ten years ago.

language that many do not understand, sometimes with disastrous consequences. The Yacht-Pool logo provides a guarantee function in this regard. But what if it is absent? Many, like most of us, still sign the charter contract along with the General Terms and Conditions blindly. Following the principle: "It will be fine." Most of the time, it goes well - but not always. Schöchl, besides his book "Die Haftung des Skippers - seine Rechte/seine Pflichten" (29.90)orders €, buch@yacht-pool.de), could write additional volumes based on distress calls from charter crews who fell victim to pitfalls in charter contracts.

Agencies and fleet operators that operate under these conditions have been awarded the "Fair Charter" quality seal by Yacht-Pool. because private agreements are generally not covered. However, there is hope. Unclear conditions and toxic clauses in charter contracts could soon be a thing of the past, or at least become the exception. All because the recreational boating industry, represented by EBI (European Boating Industry) in Brussels and ICOMIA(International Council of Marine Industry Associations) in London,

recognized the significance of this issue for nautical tourism, a conflict-free process in charter business, and ultimately, for the reputation of the entire industry. In several meetings with the presidents of national associations of charterers and charter agencies, they sought optimal terms and conditions. The clear choice was the Charter-Fair Contract from Yacht-Pool, which was already available in all relevant languages and represented a fair balance of

interests between charterers and charter companies. This was a significant accolade for Dr. Friedrich Schöchl. However, he had to sacrifice the familiar logo of his Charter-Fair Contract, which is now trusted by thousands of skippers. Nevertheless, the heading "International Yacht-Pool Terms and Conditions" effectively remains as a quality guarantee on the title of these terms and conditions, reaffirming their origin.
